Library Membership

Free library cards are available for anyone who owns property, lives, works or attends school in King Township. If you live in an area served by one of our reciprocal borrowing libraries, you may also obtain a KTPL library card. Simply bring a valid piece of identification with your name, photo and current address.

eLibrary Card

Your eLibrary card will allow you to access eBooks, eAudiobooks and our databases. eLibrary cards can be converted to a physical card so you can borrow from our physical collection. Please contact your branch for more information.

Renewing & Email Reminders

Most items may be renewed, providing no one else is waiting for them. Items may be renewed in person, by telephone or online. Our optional email notification service includes upcoming due date reminders emailed 3 days prior to the due date. Please ask staff for details.

Placing a Hold

Most items are eligible for hold requests. You may place a hold directly through the online catalogue or ask staff for assistance. Email notifications for holds are available; please ask staff for details.

Suspending a Hold While You Are Away

If you are going away and do not want your holds to become available for pickup, you can suspend them. When you return, you can re-activate your holds. While your holds are suspended, you will not lose your place in the hold queue.

Lost Materials

Library cardholders are responsible for all items checked out on their cards and for minors in their care. Charges for lost material will be applied to patron accounts.

Printing, Scanning, Photocopying

All of our branches offer printing, copying and scanning. Or, email your documents to a library printer and pick up at your local branch using our mobile printing service.

Battery recycling receptacles are located at all three branches and can be accessed during regular operating hours. In partnership with the Township of King, municipal garbage tags (along with bulk items and appliance tags) are available for purchase at all three branches.

Kids

Every Child Ready to Read

Based on the Every Child Ready to Read initiative, our fun filled, literacy-based programs are designed to encourage school readiness, including reading, numeracy and socialization skills.

We strive to provide programming for children of all ages, both in-person and virtual, to help foster a love of reading and a commitment to lifelong learning.



For Babies

Introduction to stories, finger-plays, nursery rhymes and songs for parents/caregivers and their children from birth to 2 years.

For Toddlers

Continuing to build on the core skills developed in earlier programming, these sessions offer songs, stories, and action rhymes for toddlers ages 18 months to 3 years with their parents or caregivers.

For Preschoolers

Preschoolers will enjoy stories, songs, and activities in a structured environment that focuses on school readiness and socialization skills preparing children for kindergarten.

Virtual Programs

On the Library's website you can access virtual programs, including live and recorded sessions. Check our Library Events Calendar for upcoming events and programs.

Reading Buddies

Do you have a child that is not reading at their level? Sign them up to read with a volunteer at the Library once a week for a minimum of 10 weeks. A volunteer will focus on reading one-on-one for one hour! For ages 6 and up (in Grade 1), pick up an application form at your local branch or online at kinglibrary.ca.

Math Buddies

Do you have a child that could benefit from extra math help? Sign them up to work with a volunteer at the Library once a week for a minimum of 10 weeks. A volunteer will work on math with your child one-on-one for one hour! For ages 6 to 10 (Grades 1-4), pick up an application form at your local branch or online at kinglibrary.ca.

Summer Reading Program

Help you children avoid the "summer slide" and maintain their reading level by registering them for our popular summer reading program. We offer a wide variety of programming including STEAM activities, robotics, 3D printing, movies, games and special events.

There may be a nominal charge associated to some programs.



Maker Culture at the Library

The King City Make-It Lab provides a variety of STEAM-based tools and programs for all ages, with regular opportunities for: hands-on experimental learning, critical thinking, creativity and problem solving in a collaborative learning environment. Access to the Lab is provided through a series of targeted programs, one-on-one sessions with our Maker Specialist and drop-in hours.


3D Printers

Health & Wellness Series


Partnering with experts in the community, we offer a wide range of health awareness topics.
