Using the Library

Library Membership

Free library cards are available for anyone who owns property, lives, works or attends school in King Township. If you live in an area served by one of our reciprocal borrowing libraries, you may also obtain a KTPL library card. Simply bring a valid piece of identification with your name, photo and current address.

A library card allows you to:

- Borrow material
- Check your account remotely via the library's website using your PIN
- Request email notification for holds
- Remotely access our entire digital collection
- Access printing services

Library's Mobile App

Download the Library's app and have access to the Library right from your mobile device.



eLibrary Card

Your eLibrary card will allow you to access our Digital Content such as eBooks, eAudiobooks and our databases. eLibrary cards can be converted to a physical card so you can borrow from our physical collection. Please contact your branch for more information.



Overdue/Lost Materials

Library cardholders are responsible for all items checked out on their cards, and for minors in their care. Charges for late or lost material will be applied to patron accounts. Please visit our website for a current fee schedule.

Renewing Your Materials

Most items may be renewed, providing no one else is waiting for them. Materials are renewed from the day of renewal, not from the original due date. Items may be renewed in person, by telephone or online.

Due Date Email Reminders

Our optional email notification service includes upcoming due date reminders emailed 3 days prior to the due date. Please ask staff for details.

Placing a Hold

Most items are eligible for hold requests. You may place a hold directly through the online catalogue or ask staff for assistance. Email notifications for holds are available; please ask staff for details.

Suspending a Hold While You Are Away

If you are going away and do not want your holds to become available for pickup, you can suspend them. When you return, you can re-activate your holds. While your holds are suspended, you will not lose your place in the hold queue.

Additional Services

Battery Recycling and Garbage Tags

Battery recycling receptacles are located at all three branch locations, and can be accessed during regular operating hours.

In partnership with the Township of King, municipal garbage tags (along with bulk items and appliance tags) are available for purchase at all three branch locations.

Exam Proctoring

VHS to DVD Converter

Update and preserve your memories with this free service. This service offers residents the opportunity to convert your VHS tapes to a digital file and transfer the content to DVDs or USB drives, by using the Library's equipment and conversation software. This self-driven service is free of charge, and the Library will have storage devices (DVDs and USBs) available for purchase, if needed.

Community Gathering Space

All branch locations offer space that accommodates both quiet study and group collaboration. Find a corner to read the daily newspaper, or meet with other members of the community.

Meeting/Study Rooms and Equipment Rentals

Our branches have program rooms suitable for meetings, each with a legal occupancy of 50 people. We provide tables and chairs. In addition, King City and Nobleton have access to a sink and mini refrigerator. King City now offers 3 private study/gathering rooms that are available for same day reservations at no charge. Every Child Ready to Read

Based on Every Child Ready to Read initiative, these fun-filled, literacy-based programs are designed to encourage school readiness, including reading, numeracy, and socialization skills.

The Library strives to provide programming for children of all ages, both in-person and virtual, to help foster a love of reading and a commitment to lifelong learning.

Online Programs

For Babies

Introduction to stories, finger-plays, nursery rhymes and songs for parents/caregivers and their children from birth to 2 years.

For Toddlers

Continuing to build on the core skills developed in earlier programming, these sessions offer songs, stories, and action rhymes for toddlers ages 18 months to 3 years with their parents or caregivers.
