



CHURCHES.

The early settlers built the churches of their faith as soon as possible after they had become settled. A map of this area made nearly one hundred years ago, shows that the Wesleyan Methodist Church was located on the site of the old graveyard on the north side of the road, west of Nobleton. The Primitive Methodist Church was built near the site of the present St. Albans Anglican Church. The map does not show the location of an Anglican Church at that time. The Presbyterian Church was located where the present church is situated, on the Tenth Concession of King, and it was known as the Scotch Church. There was also a Presbyterian Church where the present one is located on the farm of Lyle Stewart-----James Stewart owned the farm at that time. The Catholic Church, at that time, was also located there the present church now stands, on the Tenth Concession of King.
